Samuel graduated from high school last May. Samuel feels God’s call upon his life to work in Korea. Therefore, he entered a Korean language program at Yonsei University in Seoul. Samuel speaks well, but he wants to perfect his language abilities. He has worked hard and earned one academic scholarship thus far. Last week he was selected by the faculty to be the Korean-to-English translator for the new-student orientation day. He translated for the faculty, took questions from the students, and answered them. This was his first time to do such and was very comfortable and professional. He said the auditorium was filled and estimated about 1,500 people in attendance. He will graduate from the language program in June. Samuel plans to enroll in Korean university to obtain a major in the Korean language that will equip him for the ministry in Korea. I am a very proud of him and his attitude for the Lord’s work. He is an excellent soul winner and worker with the children.
