Dear Pastor and Church Family,

“Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.” (Ecclesiastes 4:9)

In Acts 13, the Bible says that Paul and Barnabas were ordained and sent forth to be missionaries to the Gentiles. As a result of that, many churches were started by the Apostle Paul on the mission field. However, the Apostle Paul could not have done this if it were not for many others that came along and helped him, and we all know that the Apostle Paul certainly appreciated his co-laborers.

A few months after we returned to the United States on July 25, 2007, for our first furlough, I went to visit Bro. Sam Seang, a friend who is working at the Agape Boarding School in Stockton, Missouri. I had a good visit with him and his family. Bro. Sam shared with me concerning his desire to come to Cambodia for one year to help us. At first I was surprised and asked for an explanation. “The Lord has been good to me, especially living in America. He has brought me from living in a Communist regime. Every day I was trying to survive from sickness, starvation, and execution. When we escaped to the refugee camp in Thailand, we almost did not make it. Over twenty years ago, God brought me to the land of freedom which is America. Now I am saved, and I feel that I owe God a great debt. I want to give one year of my life to God and go back to my country to share the Gospel with them,” said Bro. Sam.

Bro. Sam has six children—five girls and one boy. They are planning to leave for Cambodia this August. They are going to Cambodia as volunteers. They will be selling everything that they have and using that money as their living expenses on the mission field. Bro. Sam and his family have been a great blessing to Bro. Clemenson at the Agape Home for over seven years.

I am not writing this prayer letter asking you to help this family each month, but I am asking you if you could give a one-time love offering to help pay for their airfare tickets. This would be a blessing to them. Their plane tickets will cost between \$7,000 and \$9,000 round trip.
