Back in August, we had our first wedding at International Baptist Church. It was my privilege to perform the ceremony for two of our Hyles-Anderson College of the Philippines graduates and staff members, Emirson Ubas and Clarice Arriola. I counseled Emirson and Clarice during their days of dating, took time to give premarital counseling, and with great joy watched them become husband and wife.
