In the meantime, our future church building is progressing very nicely. God blessed us with a very good engineer, who has done a great job with the project. 
## **Dividends on Your Investment**

I met Marvin Tome years ago at the Dapitan City Jail. I did have the opportunity to share the Gospel with him, but if I remember correctly, he was really worried about his case that day, and he just couldn't focus on what I was trying to share with him. Time passed, and he got out of jail. Occasionally, I would see him driving his motor cab around the city; a motor cab is a common public transportation vehicle in the Philippines, consisting of a motorcycle and a large sidecar. He would always smile and wave, but I never had another chance to share the Gospel with him.

Several weeks ago, my wife called me at the church and told me that Marvin was at the house, wanting to see me. I told her I would be a little while, and Marvin said that he would wait. When I arrived home, Marvin was sitting on the curb in front of my house, staring blankly at the concrete in front of him. When I approached him, he turned towards me, but I could immediately see that something was wrong with his eyes. He went on to explain to me that over the last six months or so, he had been slowly losing his sight—first in one eye, then later in the other. By this time in the story, he was almost completely blind. When he had no one else to turn to, he turned to the Baptist pastor who had visited him in jail. The next day, I took him to two different doctors, and neither of them could find anything wrong with his eyes. The following Monday, I went to visit him at his house, where I met his girlfriend Joan. We talked about his eyes for a few minutes, and then I turned the conversation to the Gospel. This time, Marvin was ready to listen. He and Joan both listened intently as I carefully shared the Gospel. When I was finished, both bowed their heads and put their faith in Jesus Christ. Shortly thereafter, they began attending our church, and two weeks ago, Marvin made the decision to be baptized. We are still praying for Joan to do the same. Please pray for Marvin. He has had a CT scan, and now the doctor is recommending an MRI. Please pray that God will help us to find some answers very soon and that Marvin and Joan will continue to grow in their newfound faith.
