Speaker Pelosi’s recent visit to Taiwan aggravated the already tense situation involving China and the U.S. and ignited a buying frenzy at Guam’s grocery stores due to the fear that China would attack Guam in retaliation. Its further ricocheting effect was seen with emergency contingency plans being discussed by those we know and many islanders relocating due to the uncertainty. The military footprint here is ever increasing, and joint military exercises and war games continue to escalate in anticipation of conflict. Though the possibility of being attacked is an ever-present concern, the more pressing concerns are the already disrupted shipping supply chains, delayed grocery-store restocking, and skyrocketing prices, leading to anxiety, anger, fear, desperation, and an increase in crime. We know supply-chain disruptions and inflation are not just Guam issues; no matter where one goes, these issues are found. So, we just tell people we are “staying put” to live our lives for the Lord and to serve Him, come what may.

After leaving a place of business recently, I noticed a young man sitting on a bench, and although I was short on time, I went over to him, not wanting to miss a soul-winning opportunity. The young man’s name was Nolan, and as I quickly found out, Nolan was a “talker.” While talking with him, it took a lot of effort to keep him focused on the Gospel, but the Lord helped me. When I finished, Nolan said he believed the Gospel and then prayed with me to receive the Lord Jesus Christ into his heart as his personal Saviour. After we prayed, Nolan was about to keep talking, but I indicated that I needed to leave.
