Some weeks ago, I was driving home from Thursday visitation when a young man in his mid-twenties shouted to get my attention. When I stopped, he asked me, "Pastor, can you please pray for me?" I asked him for the specifics of his prayer request; to which he answered, "I just need prayers." After praying with him, the Lord led me to ask him about his salvation. This opened the opportunity to witness to him; after which, Shaun trusted Christ as his Saviour!

So far, eight of his family members have attended our church services. It's clear that it was not God's plan for us to reach the family but to use Shaun to do so.

The following verse was an encouragement to me in this seemingly hopeless situation:

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord." (I Corinthians 15:58)
